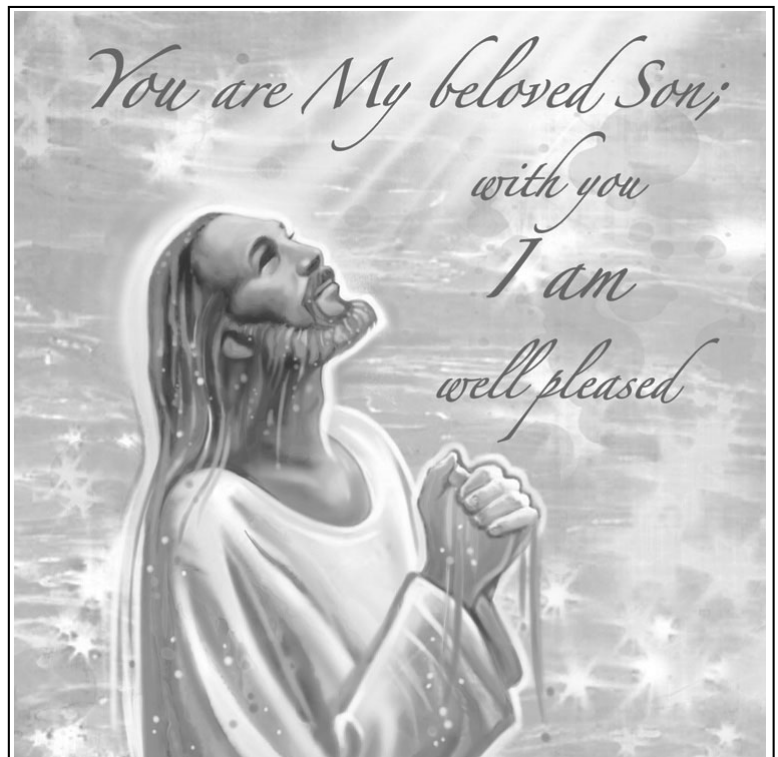

**From the Pastor's Desk . . .**

With this Sunday's celebration of the 'Baptism of Jesus,' we 'officially' bring the Christmas season to it's conclusion (although I'm aware that many of you have already taken down the wonderful decorations that gladdened our neighborhood for the past month or so.) But today's feast actually brings the season to an end, and with Monday morning's mass, we enter into the season called 'Ordinary Time.' What a shift in mood, to go from 'Christmas' to 'Ordinary time'!

In today's gospel, we hear the account of Jesus presenting himself to John at the Jordan River, where John has been baptizing the multitudes. This moment in the life of Jesus, and our salvation history, took place when Jesus was thirty years of age, and it ushered in, what we refer to as his 'public ministry.' This would be the beginning of the last three years of his life, during which time he revealed through his example, through his teachings and his miracles, the love of God for all of us! So with this Sunday we jump from the infant in Bethlehem to the itinerant preacher in Nazareth, who is now thirty years old and ready to begin the work of salvation for which he came into this world!

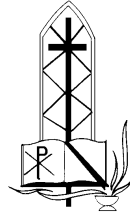
So how does that speak to us today? First and foremost, today's feast is a reminder, that it was through the waters of our own baptism that we 'put on Christ!' Each of us became members of the 'Christian' community on the day of our individual baptism. The name 'Christian,' simply means, 'another Christ,' so the feast is also a reminder that we are called to do what Jesus did. As 'other Christ's' in the world, we need to also reveal God's love of us through our love of one another. Could this reminder be more relevant, or needed, for our world today? More then ever, we need to be 'other Christ's' in our city, our state, our country and in the world! More then ever, we need to bring the message of peace and reconciliation, to our brothers and sisters. More then ever, we need to scatter the darkness that still pervades our world, by sharing the light of Christ! More then ever we need to remind ourselves . . .

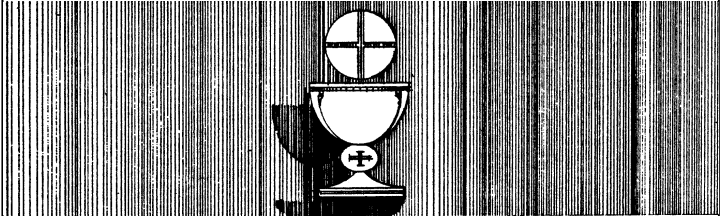
**+ Remembering our Faithful Departed +**

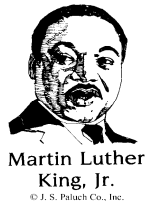
