From the Pastor's Desk...

The 'Season of Ordinary Time!' With our Sunday gathering this weekend, we usher in the **Twelfth Week of Ordinary Time** on our Church calendar. This 'season' will now carry us to the end of our Church year, on the Thirty-Fourth Sunday of Ordinary Time, which is celebrated as the Feast of Christ the King. The week after, we begin a 'new' Church year with the 'Season of Advent.' So what is 'Ordinary Time' in the Church?

The term 'Ordinary Time' may be misleading. In the context of the liturgical (Church) year, the term 'ordinary' does not mean 'usual or average.' Ordinary here means, 'not seasonal.' Ordinary Time is that part of the church year that lies 'outside the seasons' of Advent & Christmas and then Lent & Easter. In Ordinary Time, the Church celebrates the mystery of Christ not in one specific aspect of his life, but in all its aspects. By contrast, during the season of Lent, we focus on those events that ultimately lead to his arrest, trial and crucifixion. The readings that we reflect on during the season of Ordinary Time, help to instruct us on how to live out our Christian faith in our daily lives.

'Ordinary Time' in the Church's year occurs in two sections. The first part begins on the Monday following the Christmas Season, which ends with the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord on the Sunday following the Feast of the Epiphany. It lasts until the Tuesday before 'Ash Wednesday,' which then ushers in the Seasons of Lent and Easter. Ordinary Time resumes after the Easter Sunday and continues until the evening before the First Sunday of Advent.

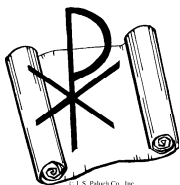
So what can we expect during this season? During the liturgical year, the scripture readings for the seasons of Advent, Christmas, Lent and Easter have very prominent themes, and focus our attention on very specific aspects and moments in the life of Jesus. During Ordinary Time the readings are not chosen according to a 'theme,' rather, they present in a continuous fashion, the life and work of Jesus Christ as proclaimed in the Gospels of either Matthew, Mark, or Luke (*this year our readings are taken from Mark's Gospel.*)

Each of the seasons also have a "liturgical color" connected to them . . . Most of you will immediately associate the color 'purple' with the Lenten season, and 'white' with the Easter season. The color of 'Ordinary Time' is 'green,' which is a sign and symbol for 'hope.'

The Symbol for Ordinary Time is the 'Chi Rho,' which is a Christian symbol that dates from the early Church. It is comprised of the first two letters of the Greek word for 'Messiah,' *Christos* - the 'Chi' looks like the letter 'X,' and the letter 'Rho' looks like the letter 'P.' This abbreviation became a symbol representing Jesus Christ.

Associated also with this time of year, is the end of school and summer recess! So consider this the 'final lesson' for this school year! Enjoy the summer season that is now upon us!

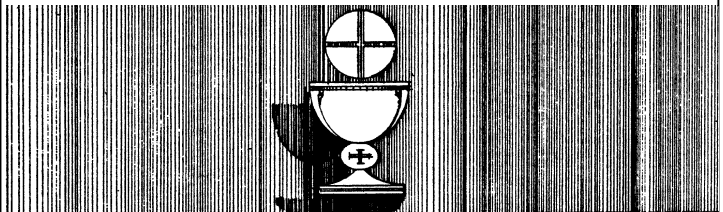


+ Confirmation Retreat +


