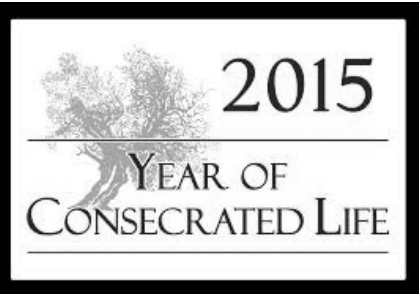

+ Rev. Patrick Dennis Boyle, O.F.M. +



As we brought to your attention last month, our Holy Father Pope Francis proclaimed 2015 a 'Year of Consecrated Life,' which began with the *First Sunday of Advent, November 29, 2014* and will continue until the *'Feast of the Presentation,'*

February 2, 2016 (which means it's a little longer than 'a year.') The year began with a special service at the Cathedral of St. James with Bishop Nicholas DiMarzio, in the presence of the consecrated Religious who are actively ministering in the Diocese. Last month, we shared a 'profile' of *Sr. Margarita (the 'senior' member of our Staff),* and continuing this month, descending in age, we share another 'profile,' this month being dedicated to our *Pastor, Fr. Patrick.* These 'profiles' will continue each month until January, at which time we will close this 'Year of Consecrated Life,' with a liturgy and parish celebration in honor of the consecrated religious who staff our parish.

Fr. Patrick, the son of the late Marian and Eugene Boyle, was born, December 15, 1952 in Easton, Pennsylvania, located on the banks of the Delaware River, directly across the river from Phillipsburg, New Jersey, where, along with his five brothers and sisters, he grew up. He attended St. Philip & St. James Grammar School, and then Phillipsburg Catholic High School., and upon graduation, he entered Immaculate Conception Seminary College of Philosophy in Troy, New York, in the fall of 1971. He began working on a "double major" hoping to obtain a degree in art, with the intent of teaching art in one of the four high schools that the Franciscans staffed at that time. He graduated in the spring of 1975 and began his canonical novitiate year at St. Anthony Friary in Catskill, New York, on August 15, 1975. One year later, 'Friar' Patrick made his first profession of vows and journeyed on to Brighton, Massachusetts where he entered St. John Seminary (*Archdiocese of Boston*) and obtained his Masters in Divinity, while spending the summers working toward his Masters of Fine Arts at Boston University. A 'perpetual student' for nearly ten years, he made his Solemn Profession of Vows in September, 1979, was ordained a deacon in January of 1980 and then ordained a priest on October 18, 1980. This October, Fr. Patrick will celebrate his *35th Anniversary of Priesthood.*

Over the past thirty-five years, he has worked and ministered in four locations. He ministered for twelve years at St. Anthony of Padua Church in Manhattan as a Deacon, then as the Pastoral Associate and then as Pastor; for six years he ministered as a chaplain in the Pastoral Care Department of St. Cabrini Nursing home in Dobbs Ferry, New York; then in 1999, he was named Vicar Provincial for the Franciscan Province of the Immaculate Conception, a position he held for twelve years before coming to Our Lady of Peace. Fr. Patrick presently is a member of the Provincial Board of his Franciscan Province, as well as a Board member for St. Francis Xavier Catholic Academy and for the C.H.I.P.S. organization. He is also 'Dean' for our area of the Brooklyn Diocese. *May God bless him with many more years of service!*



Solemnity of the 'Assumption' of the Blessed Virgin Mary

Next *Saturday, August 15th,* the Church celebrates the *'Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary.'* The 'assumption' of Mary to heaven at the end of her earthly life, is a 'dogma' of our faith. We hold in faith, that at the end of her earthly life, God would not

allow the natural corruption of her bodily remains, and so she was 'assumed to heaven,' both body and soul. This is a 'solemnity feast' for the Church universal, and is 'usually,' honored as a 'holy day of obligation' in our country. There is always a bit of confusion when a holy day of obligation falls on a Saturday. In such cases, as it does this year, the 'obligation' to attend mass is lifted. However, since this is a major feast of our Church, and especially for those who have strong devotion to our Blessed Mother, we have added a *Saturday morning mass at 9 o'clock* to our weekend schedule.

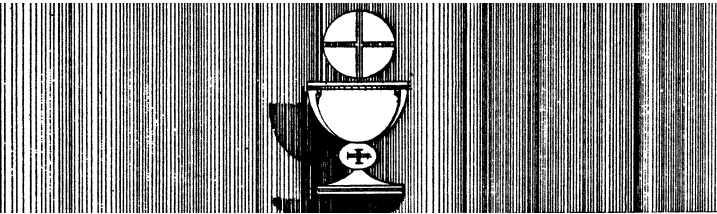

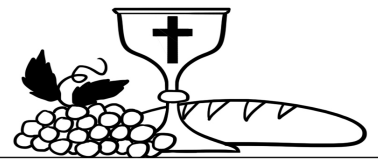
