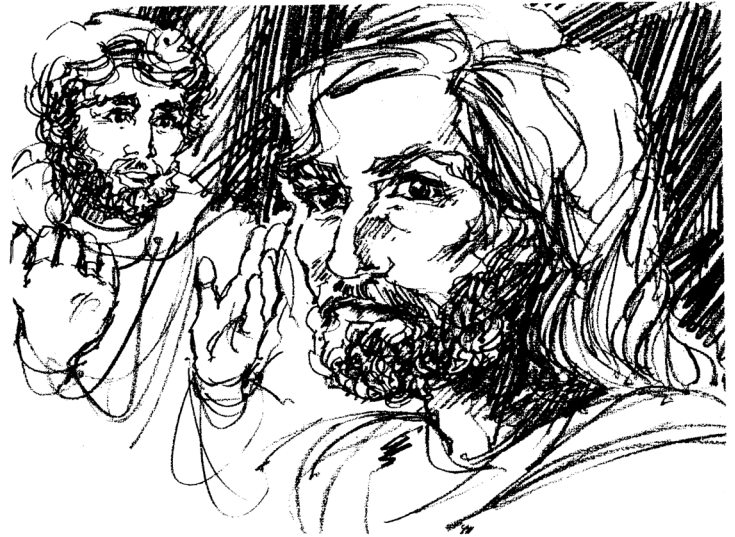

YEAR OF CONSECRATED LIFE

+ Friar Brian Jordan, O.F.M. +

As we continue to journey through the remaining months of this *'Year of Consecrated Life,'* we have been sharing a little profile and history of each of the Religious members of our Staff and community here at Our Lady of Peace. Following in chronological order, starting with the *'eldest'* member of our Staff, we have profiled *Sr. Margareta Barrera*, then *Fr. Patrick Boyle*, and now *Fr. Brian Jordan*.

Fr. Brian has been a member of our community here at Our Lady of Peace *'in residence,'* for the past three years, since embracing the ministry of chaplain at St. Francis College, located here in Brooklyn. Born on July 25, 1955, Fr. Brian is the son of Gerard Jordan and the late Eileen Jordan, and he is a *'native son,'* having been born and raised here in Brooklyn. He is one of seven in a family of four brothers and two sisters.

Fr. Brian began his journey with the Franciscans in August of 1977, as an *'Affiliate'* with the Province of the Most Holy Name of Jesus. The *'Motherhouse Church'* of his Province is the Church of St. Francis on 31st Street in midtown Manhattan, and is known by many of you. He entered their Novitiate in June of 1978 and professed his first vows on January 9, 1979. His solemn profession of vows took place on January 19, 1982 and his ordination to priesthood followed in May of 1983. He holds a Master of Divinity degree from Washington Theological Union in Washington, D.C., as well as a Doctor of Ministry degree from Andover Newton Theological School, Newton, Massachusetts and a Master of Professional Studies in Industrial and Labor Relations from Cornell University, Ithaca, New York.

During his thirty-six years of religious life, Fr. Brian's pastoral experience has included ministry at Holy Cross Church, Bronx, New York; St. Anthony Shrine Church, Boston, Massachusetts; St. Camillus Church, (*as Pastor and Guardian,*) Silver Springs, Maryland; St. Francis of Assisi Church, New York, and Holy Name Church also in New York.

A marathon runner, (*until his knees started to show a little wear and tear,*) Fr. Brian had successfully run sixty-one marathons when he planned to run his sixty-second, (*and last,*) NYC Marathon until *'Super Storm Sandy'* figuratively brought our city to her knees. He often ran in the name of the *'Labor Unions'* he has been supportive of, and to whom he continues to be chaplain. Although he didn't intend to run, he was present at the Boston Marathon two years ago, when there was a bombing at the finish line. Fr. Brian had celebrated mass at the starting line

of the marathon for the police and firemen who were running, and he was there at the finish line when the bombs exploded.

He has been a chaplain to both the police and fire departments since the terrorist attacks on the World Trade Towers in 2001. At the time, he was a member of the staff of St. Francis Church in mid-town Manhattan, where *Fr. Mychal Judge* was also in residence. Fr. Mychal was chaplain to the fire department, and responding to the news of the attack on the Twin Towers, rushed to be of assistance, and died while ministering to others. He was considered the first official casualty of the Twin Towers attack. Fr. Brian stepped in immediately, and continued to be of support to the *'first-responders'* as well as to their families and countless volunteers. He celebrated mass regularly at *'Ground Zero'* during the massive clean up, and sadly participated at too many funerals and memorial services for those whose lives were lost. He continues to the present, to be chaplain to both the Police and Fire Departments. To his credit, and because of his consistent support to the victims, first-responders and their families, he has been personally invited to participate at the *'Inter-Religious Ceremony'* that will take place next week, when Pope Francis visits *'Ground Zero.'*

Fr. Brian's energy and willingness to be of help wherever needed, is exemplary, and his *'Irish humor'* is a gift to our friar community here at Our Lady of Peace. *May God bless him with many more years of service!*

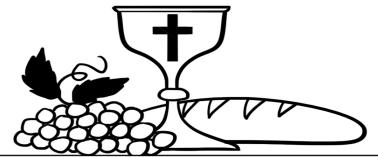
+ A Taste of Mexico +

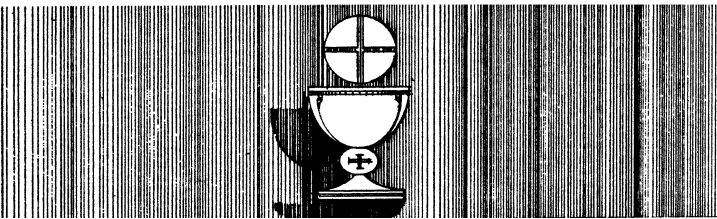

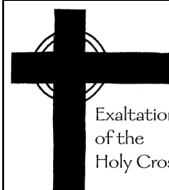
